- \*Dr. Aziz A. Khanifar, who recently joined RGW, completed a Fellowship in Medical Retina & Research at the Duke Eye Center and a Fellowship in Vitreoretinal Surgery at Weill Cornell Medical College. He has developed an expertise in treating patients with age-related macular degeneration, diabetes and retinal vascular diseases. Dr. Khanifar, the only full-time Hispanic retinal specialist in the D.C. area, is a frequent presenter at national meetings, has authored numerous articles and serves as a reviewer for Retina and Journal of Pediatric Ophthalmology & Strabismus.
